business that has been part of UC for some 40 odd years. This is the UC Barber Shop Joe Marinesi started in

1964 in the shopping center on Governor Drive and Regents Rd. There was a pharmacy, a bank, the UC Library, the Post Office, a Jonathan's Supermarket and a host of other businesses. The neighborhood was new; the neighbors were new, and it was the start of a history which is going strong today, so many years later. Joe moved his Barber Shop to the shopping center at Governor and Genesee in 1969, and there it has stayed ever since. Joe ran it for many years before retiring and handing the business over to his son Russ, who ran

it until his passing four years ago. Then it was bought by Xavier Valle, who runs it now. It remains the quaint little place it always was, where you can get a very good

haircut for \$8 and get a lot of stimulating conversation, hear a lot of community news and enjoy the camaraderie


# University City Church of Christ Pastor......Kurt Fuller



# Swanson Pool Enhancement Update.....

After voting unanimously to support an expansion of Swanson Pool at their board September meeting, University City Community Association scheduled Swanson as the sole topic for their October general meeting. There was a great turnout on Wednesday evening, October 10th at the University City High School Media Center for a session on the improvement of Swanson. Almost 50 interested members of the community showed up to listen and then talk about what they want in a new pool. A representative sampling of the UCHS boys' water polo team was in attendance.

Longtime UC activist Sandy Lippe introduced the chairwoman of the Committee to Improve Swanson Pool, Julia Cooper, who gave a short presentation. It highlighted the current uses and



Swanson pool today....


users of Swanson. It also noted the drawbacks of the pool's current size which limit its use as a competition pool by the high school aquatics teams as well as its revenue-generating potential.

A larger pool would maintain University City as a a community attractive to young families, not to mention its enhancement to property values. Committee members are very aware that the City has little or no money for a new Swanson pool. If we want a new pool, we will have to raise the money ourselves. An original owner of property in UC noted how proud she was that her family had participated in the property assessment to fund the construction of Standley Park and Swanson Pool in the early 1970's. There was no pool here; it was all canyon.

At the end of the formal presentation, the meeting broke up into small groups for discussion. Each group then presented its ideas to the entire audience. Parking, of course, is a concern and various solutions were offered. Different sizes and pool configurations were presented. One group suggested that community fund-raising might be easier if improvement of Standley Park as a whole were included, as well as beautification of the medians along Governor Drive (a long-stalled project).

There is an issue with the integrity of the soil at Swanson, and we will need an analysis by a soils engineer to determine the suitability of the site for expansion. If it is not suitable, we will look at alternatives at the Nobel Athletic Fields and at Doyle Park.

All community input is welcome and encouraged. If there is anyone in the community with professional expertise in the areas of fund-raising or soils engineering, the committee would greatly appreciate their input. # Did You Know?

...Those whose homes were destroyed or damaged by the fires will need help in the days and months ahead. **Volunteer San Diego** is coordinating with the County, 2-1-1 and community organizations to provide volunteers where needed. For information, go to

...Some recently implemented programs in the San Diego region proved to be very valuable resources during the October Wildfires. According to SANDAG (San Diego Association of Governments), a record number of area residents used the free 511 call system (accessible from any phone) and website. The 511 phone system received more than 87,500 calls between Monday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> and Thursday, October 25th. The previous weekly average was 11.000 calls. More than 38,000 visitors. almost 10 times the previous weekly average, visited the 511 website www.511sd.com for updates and information about the fires. SANDAG is evaluating the system's performance to see how the system could be more effectively used in future emergencies. Remember, you can utilize the call system and website as a one-stop resource for traffic and transportation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week...

...The City's and County's Reverse 9-1-1 calling systems played major roles in the systematic evacuation of specific areas. If you haven't already registered your cell phone number or VOIP (voice over internet) number with both systems, you're encouraged to do so now. Visit www.sdcounty.ca.gov/oes/ready/ signup.htmlAlertSanDiego to register your cell phone, VolP phone. and email address only. Listed and unlisted land line phones are already included in both the City's and the County's databases and do not need to be registered.

## **Christmas Eve Music**



The **Traditional Choir** of Our Mother of Confidence Church will be performing excerpts from Benjamin Britten's "A **Ceremony of Carols**" and an assortment of other standard, traditional carols before the 10:00 P.M. service on Christmas Eve,

December 24<sup>th</sup>, 2007. The singing will begin at 9:15 P.M. in the church, as a prelude to the service. The choir has been featured at the UC Christmas Tree lighting for several years and will be a part of the program this year as well. The Britten piece was written by the composer to fill the time he spent in a transatlantic crossing in the early 40s. It is a setting of Old English poems celebrating the Birth of Christ. The church is located at the corner of Governor Drive and Regents Road.

Admission is free. All are welcome!

### Hanukkah is....

The Hebrew word Hanukkah means "dedication." The roots of this name, and the Hanukkah holiday, come from the second century B.C.E. (Before the Common Era). Chafing under foreign domination, a band of Jews led by Mattathias took to the hills of Judea in open revolt against the Seleucid regime of Antiochus IV.

Mattathias' son Judah took charge of the rebellion after his father's death. He was given the nickname "the Maccabee" ("the hammer"). Antiochus sent thousands of well-trained and well-armed troops to the land of Israel to crush the rebellion. The Maccabees responded with a brilliant campaign of guerrilla warfare, and succeeded in driving the foreigners from their land. Jewish fighters entered Jerusalem in December, 164 B.C.E. They found the sacred Temple in shambles, defiled and desecrated by foreign soldiers. They cleansed the Temple and re-dedicated it on the 25th day of the Jewish month of Kislev. They observed a feast of dedication for eight days in honor of their historic victory.

The contemporary observance of Hanukkah features the lighting of a hanukkiyah, a special Hanukkah menorah with eight branches and a ninth holder for the shamash, or helper candle. Popular legend connects this ritual with the tale of the cruse of pure oil that miraculously burned for eight days rather than one.

On the first night of Hanukkah, two candles are placed in the menorah. One serves as the shamash to be used for lighting the other candle. On each successive night, another candle is added to the menorah. By the time we reach the last night of Hanukkah, eight candles are glowing brightly in celebration of this beautiful festival.

In the broad sweep of Jewish tradition, Hanukkah is considered a minor holiday. It is not a yom tov, a holy day, akin to Rosh Hashanah or Passover. Hanukkah, like Purim, is a post-Biblical holiday, a happy, fun-filled celebration for the young and the young-at-heart.

The traditional greeting Jews extend to one another during this holiday is "hag orim same'ah." Happy Feast of Lights! Happy Hanukkah!

# How **DID** Your Street Get it's Name?

If you have wondered where your street

University City has many streets named after Nobel Laureates as well as colleges and universities. We had an article in August 2003 detailing the names of the people after whom our streets got their names. A gentleman by the name of Scott Baldwin, a past president of EdUCate, did the research for us. UC Residents have expressed an interest in re-publishing the article for it's general knowledge value to those of us who might be interested. See if you can find your street in the list of famous people. The list gives the year and the category for which they were recognized in Stockholm. # University City High School Fields Project Update

The Centurion Foundation of University City High School has been working hard to get the athletic fields at UCHS renovated. Three years ago, the thought of a complete renovation of the athletic fields at UCHS was just a vision; but over the past few years, significant progress has been made toward making this project a reality. In September, a formal presentation was made before the University City Planning Group, and the UCPG, Executive Board voted to recommend to the City Council that this project be added to the North University City Public Facilities Financing Plan and Facilities Benefit Assessment (FBA) for the Fiscal Year 2008. They also agreed to help fund this approximately 8.5 million dollar project up to 35% with an absolute cap of 3 million dollars. Following the recommendation of the UCPG this motion went to city council and passed as well. This is all contingent upon The Centurion Foundation of UCHS being able to raise the additional monies needed and the execution of a Joint Use Agreement between the City of San Diego and the San Diego Unified School District.

University City is considered park deficient because of the size and population of our community. As such, a project like this is viable and supports the needs of the community and the schools. With the redevelopment of the athletic fields at UCHS, the facilities would be shared with the community after school hours. Before a Joint Use Agreement is worked out, the school site and the City would have to work out a specific schedule. The City wants to know that they will have access to the facilities about 50% of the time.

The new administration at UCHS, under the direction of the new Principal Mike Price, is on board with this project and will be working on this and other related issues over the next several months. John Hutsel, a staff member and Track and Field coach at UCHS has been working with Petco Park and the Padres to get University City High School in line to receive a donation of turf. Apparently, the turf at Petco Park is replaced every year. We are hoping to get the first donation of turf February 2008. This turf would be used to refurbish the upper fields at UCHS. Before receiving the turf, the upper fields will have to be prepared and the irrigation reconfigured. This alone is about a \$150,000 renovation just to prep the fields and fix the irrigation. As you can see, there is a lot to be done. If we all work together, we can make this a reality; and the facilities would be a tremendous asset to our community.

The Centurion Foundation of University City High School is looking for the community's help in the following areas. We are looking for new board members. Our existing board has many members who will be done after this year. We are looking for interested community members to shadow some of these positions for the remainder of this school year and then take over the positions next year. We are also looking for individuals with a strong marketing background to help assist in grant writing and putting together detailed brochures for solicitation of corporate sponsors. We also need someone who can help us develop a website so that we can keep the community better informed about the Centurion Foundation of UCHS and the UCHS Fields Project.
