



Residents of University City have been able to avail themselves of two recycling programs.

The Christmas Tree recycling which ended on January 19th, which was a well patronized program with thousands of trees being recycled.


Fund Raising Book Sale at the UC Library

O Christmas Tree!

It was a sad sight to behold. Christmas trees which, once in their bejeweled glory, delighted families in living rooms across University City, now lay awaiting a trip to the recycling plant to be turned into mulch. This is a real, though sad, commentary on the transitional nature of life. But there is good news. Every year 50 million Christmas trees are purchased in the United States and more than 30 million are turned in much. Evergreens produce a nitrogen rich mulch which helps decompose other vegetation faster than it normally would.

Mulch containing ground up evergreen needles and wood provide excellent protection for newly planted spring flower seeds, keep weeds from overpowering shrubs in public parks and make those areas not covered with vegetation pleasant to look at along side freeways and county streets. So the next time you see a ocean of bright color while driving to work or to the grocery store, know that your Christmas Tree may have contributed to helping mother nature keep up the good work as she goes about her vernal duties in Spring.






