

To dispose of these items, call (858) 694-7000 to make an appointment at the Household Hazardous Waste Transfer Facility located at the Miramar Landfill entrance on Convoy Street, just north of Highway 52. Televisions and computer monitors will not be accepted either but may be recycled at the Miramar Recycling Center (858) 268-8971.

President's Perspective...

As is usual for me early on a Sunday morning, I was quietly reading the local Sunday paper. Suddenly, my reverie was shattered by unusual screams coming from out on my culde-sac. I raced to the door and saw that a fire had just started in the home directly across from me. The youngster and his babysitter who were in the home were safely evacuated and were taken in by a neighbor up the street. My next door neighbor, John Schnabel, wanted to douse the early flames with the hose attached to the front of the home. The police, being in the neighborhood at the time, arrived quickly and restrained him from his heroic efforts.

The fire engine from U.C. arrived within ten minutes. The firepersons said they were lucky that there was little or no traffic on Genesee, due to it being early on a Sunday morning. Other units arrived from Clairemont, La Jolla and Kearny Mesa. The firefighters were able to contain the flames and limit the fire from engulfing the entire home. Fortunately, the wind was blowing to the Northeast, so the flames did not spread to the homes on either side of the house on fire. The whole scene was a very scary experience for all of the neighbors living on the street. There were many "what ifs" exchanged between us.

## \$71,000 Awarded to University City Public Schools at EdUCate! Friendraiser Event

EdUCate!. the University City Foundation for Public Schools, has announced the award of 46 educational grants totaling \$71,000 in response to teacher requests from Curie, Doyle, and Spreckels elementary schools, Standley Middle School, University City High School. This is the 13th year that EdUCate! has funded requests amounting to more than half a million dollars in awards to the five public schools. The grants were awarded on April 22nd at EdUCate!'s fifth annual Friendraiser which showcased the five schools and provided a venue for the community and EdUCate!'s loyal supporters to see the wonderful programs at the schools and their EdUCate! dollars at work. The Grants Award Ceremony, along with the Honor-A-Teacher Program recognition, took place at UC High School. This year's activities included student performances; a showcase of student academic and art work: class-

room demonstrations; games, activities, and food sales to benefit the schools; Teacher Wish Lists that attendees fulfilled; and a special performance by the five talented principals.

Of this year's grant awards, \$25,256 was awarded in the Language Arts category for items such as poetry programs, classroom and school library enhancement, tape players and books on tape, take-home reading programs, supplemental materials for English Language Learners. In the Science & Math category, \$10,487 was awarded for the creation of a science pond, microscopes, science kits. a science library, and math supplemental materials. In the Humanities category, \$6,719 was awarded for interactive history programs, history and social studies DVD's, and history textbooks. In the Fine Arts category, \$6,833 was awarded for new band uniforms, art instructional videos, and art supplies. (...cont on page 6)

...At press time, we were told the long awaited EIR (Environmental Impact Report) on the seven alternatives for the UC North South Transportation Corridor (Genesee Av./Regents Rd) is on track to be released the end of April or beginning of May. There will be a 30 day review period following the release of the document, and a public hearing will be scheduled before City Council...

... You should be able to sustain yourself and your family for 3 days following a disaster. The CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) program is a nationwide program designed to help ordinary citizens prepare for survival in the event of emergencies, disasters or terrorist attacks. The San Diego Fire Rescue Dept. began offering CERT training following the Cedar fire in 2003. The goal is to have 50 member CERT teams in each community. UC's CERT is growing but needs more volunteers. Funding has been extended, and classes will be offered in the fall. You can sign up now. Visit www.certsandiego.org, email cert@sandiego.gov.. or call 619 533-3075 for more information. As a CERT volunteer, you'll take care of yourself and your family first, then your community. You'll learn practical and valuable life saving measures from putting together a disaster plan and supply kit to light search and rescue and disaster response organization skills...



In the Classroom Technology category, \$20,781 was awarded for computers, document cameras, projectors, and DVD players. In the **Physical Education** category, \$1,000 was awarded for kindergarten play equipment.

A non-profit organization made up of community volunteers, EdUCate! has the goal of improving the quality of public education in the University City community by funding supplemental resources that otherwise cannot be provided because of state and district financial limitations and budget cuts. EdUCate! raises the majority of the money by producing the annual Taste of the Triangle which features many

fine area restaurants and a very popular Silent Auction. Funds are also raised through the foundation's Honor-A-Teacher Program and Friendraiser, the annual showcase of the five schools.
