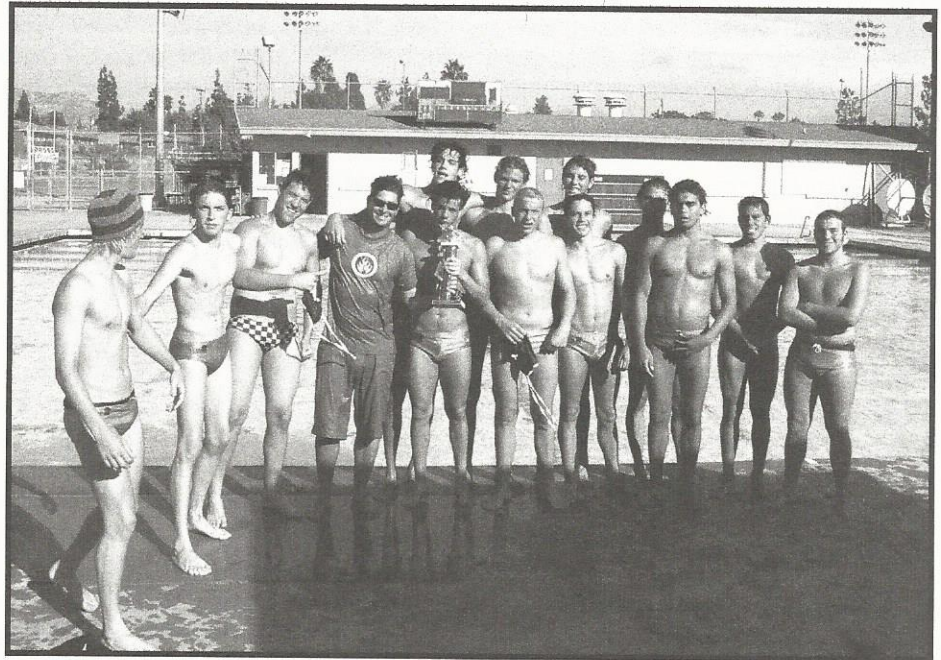

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## Swanson Pool set for closure March 5 – June 11

### Communities must raise funds to keep pools open

As a result of City of San Diego budget cuts, all city pools will close on a rotating basis unless the communities raise the amount of funds specified to keep their pool open. Swanson Pool will be closed from March 5<sup>th</sup> - June 11<sup>th</sup> which includes Spring Break—a time when the pool generally offers programs for individuals to certify as a lifeguard, enroll in a camp, learn to swim and of course, relax by the pool-side.

According to City officials, \$80,000 is the cost to keep the facility open and normal programs running. The only way that the pool will remain open is with help from the University City community in raising \$80,000 through donations, sponsorships, grants and/or rentals. Any money raised above and beyond that amount will allow programs to run at either a discounted rate or even at no cost. If the pool collects a portion of the \$80,000, the pool will remain open until the funds raised are exhausted.

Swanson Memorial Pool has been a part of UC since the early 70's when residents formed an assessment dis-

trict to build the rec center and pool. Thousands of people have grown up learning to swim there, and some now see their children and grandchildren learning to swim. The pool has a new deck, diving board and slides. In the past, the pool hosted functions like last year's Water Fitness Frenzy and many swim teams including the Swanson Stingray Swim Team and Water Polo Team.

University City is an established community, and hopefully local individuals, organizations and businesses will once again come forward for our pool. Help spread the word. The pool is available for rentals by individuals, organizations and companies for private functions including company parties. Clairemont had to raise \$100,000 and actually raised \$102,000 through a donation. Can the University City community raise the funds through various means to keep Swanson Pool open?
