We can not take light bulbs/tubes, dirt, construction or demolition rubble, tires, or hazardous wastes (wet

paint, motor oil, or batteries). For information on what is accepted or not, please call 858-694-7000.

We will also be organizing volunteer crews to pick up trash from the sidewalks and medians along Governor Drive, Genesee, and Regents Road. Did You Know? . . .

(On the Go Transportation Solutions for Older Adults age 60 and over, a program of Jewish Senior Services Council delivered by Jewish Family Service, is now being offered in the University City, La Jolla, Clairemont area. There is a \$20 enrollment fee to utilize the services unless a member of one of the participating organizations. All riders must be mentally alert. Alissa Messian, On the Go Education and Outreach Coordinator, spoke at the April UCPG (University Community Planning

Group) meeting and explained the program's three components which offer both individual and group transportation. Volunteers provide individual transportation to medical and personal appointments through the Smiles and Rides[®] program. On the Shuttles provide group Go transportation to Jewish Family

Service's Older Adult Centers, the Lawrence Family Jewish Community Center, synagogues, religious events, shopping centers, and other cultural outings and events. On the Go also offers organized group excursions to locations throughout San Diego County and surrounding areas. Shopping Shuttles and Let's Go to Lunch Shuttles to specific locations on scheduled dates cost \$6.00 round trip for door to door service. Excursion Shuttles are \$5.00 and up depending upon distance and admittance fee. ...You can exchange up to 5 incandescent light bulbs 75W or higher and up to 2 halogen lamps for an equivalent number of compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFL's) and CFL torchiere lamps at Lighting Turn In events offered by SDGE. The nearest one to UC is Saturday, May 30th at the WalMart store at 3382 Murphy Canyon Rd. You must fill out an application, bring a valid California ID and copy of your SDGE bill for identification purposes only. You can download the application www.sdge.com/residential/ at lightingTurnIn.shtml. There is a maximum of 5 bulbs and 2 lamps per household per year.

... To legally dispose CFL's, place the bulb in a sealed plastic bag and deposit it in the CFL recycle bin at any Home Depot location...



Saste of the Triangle 2009 was a spectacular

success – EdUCate's best event ever! Gross proceeds surpassed the \$100,000 mark for the first time. More than fifty laptop computers will be put into UC area classrooms this year thanks to your generosity.

The evening got underway at the Hilton La Jolla Torrey Pines before sunset, allowing guests to appreciate golf course views during registration and a cocktail reception. Professional auctioneer Bill Menish ran the Live Auction while guests sampled tastes from a few of the twenty-one featured restaurants. The live auction alone garnered forty-three thousand dollars, a miracle during these tough economic times!

The largest item ever auctioned at "Taste" was this year's complete custom kitchen remodel. Parents of UC public school students donated products or services to comprise the project. Allison Dorvillier, a Spreckels parent, conceived the idea after making a similar donation to The Bishop's School in La Jolla, where many of her high-end kitchen design customers send their kids. Allison recruited general contractor Dave Hansen, whose daughters attend UCHS, to be the project manager. Dave recruited his basketball buddy Matt Martine, owner of Infinity Tile (and dad of UC students) to lay the floors and backsplashes. The list goes on, proving that it takes a village to build a kitchen. And it takes a great buyer to realize how to spot a bargain while donating to a great cause – five bidders vied for the chance to win the ultimate UC kitchen, with the Tom family ultimately landing the prize.

Mr. Menish moved quickly from the Live Auction to "Fund An Item"

pledges. This year's "items" were laptop computers for University City classrooms. Current and prior EdUCate! Board members challenged attendees to match the Boards' five thousand dollar donation, and the crowd did not disappoint! Thirteen attendees donated a total of fifty-four hundred (fully tax-deductible) dollars.

After a heartwarming video presentation featuring a spunky Curie student, guests filtered outdoors, where they sampled gourmet cuisine served by some of San Diego's most illustrious chefs. Bernard Guillas of the Marine Room personally served patrons (on a Friday night, no less!). Paul McCabe slaved over scallops, Jason Graham carefully seared healthy ahi, and Luca Mazzolani plied folks with pasta. All of the food was top notch this year and, thanks to the fabulous restaurateurs, nobody went away hungry!

Diners explored the restaurant tables, and bidders circled the outdoor terrace and silent auction offerings, while listening to a trio of Standley Middle School teacher-musicians: Phillip Marcus, Ray Conseur, and Dan Coulson. Silent auction tables closed and bids were tallied, adding up to almost twenty-five thousand dollars.

Those who felt a late evening chill moved inside and warmed up by dancing, a wonderful way to celebrate living in a tight-knit community of people who value public education! Couples and groups danced as if their kids weren't watching, but secretly took pride in the fact that so many students had volunteered at the event and were, in fact, trying to figure out the odd 70's and 80's dance styles.

William H. Standley Middle School Namesake:


William Harrison Standley (<u>18</u> December <u>1872</u> - <u>25</u> October <u>1963</u>) was a <u>U.S. admiral</u>. He served as the <u>chief of naval</u>

operations between 1933 and 1937. He also served as the <u>U.S.</u> <u>ambassador to the Soviet Union</u> from 1941 until 1943. Standley lived in retirement in San Diego until his death on 25 October 1963.



Other namesakes of William H. Standley are the Admiral William Standley State Recreation Area is a state recreation area located north of the

city of <u>Santa Rosa, California</u>, on the <u>Eel River</u> in <u>Mendocino County</u> and the Depart of the Navy named a guided missile frigate USS William H. Standley in the early '60's.
