Your challenge is to DREAM BIG about the community's future and share your ideas.


The UCCA is pleased to provide an opportunity to share specific project ideas and comments regarding overall priorities with your friends and fellow UC residents.

Fixing Up Our Schools and the Neighborhood

We are continuing on our quest to integrate our neighborhood schools into our local communities. There are many ongoing improvements to UC High sports facilities that will benefit students from all of our UC schools.

Imagine UC 2020 is another step in this direction. We are looking at how we can use school district resources to improve our schools and enhance our community at the same time. One proposal is to improve the school district/park joint use area from Standley Middle School to Spreckels Elementary. Ideas include an enhanced aquatics center at Standley Park that would allow for high school practice and competition, swimming instruction for all of the UC schools and continued use by the public; a jogging track around the park connecting the two schools that could be used by PE classes and running clubs and available to the neighbors the rest of the time.

ImproveUC already has been developing a plan for a permanent stage/pavilion in the park for community performances, which could be utilized for outdoor school performances and events. We also need to look at how to make Governor Drive pedestrian and bike friendly to enhance access to this neighborhood gathering place

We will have a special community meeting co-sponsored by San Diego Unified, UC Community Association and ImproveUC. We will present the above ideas, listen to feedback and solicit other ideas to improve our community. We want to develop a plan that will take us from now to the year 2020. Don't miss this opportunity to give your input. It will be held on Wednesday, February 11 at 6:30 p.m. at the Standley Middle School Media Center in the center of the campus. I am proud to serve Council District One as the newly elected San Diego City Council President. As we enter the new year, there are many issues to address, and I'm looking forward to working collaboratively with the Mayor and my Council colleagues to tackle the challenges ahead.

My top priorities for the coming year include:

1. Fiscal Year 2016 Budget: I look forward to approving a budget that increases essential public services such as police, fire and lifeguards, includes more funding for essential infrastructure needs, including more street resurfacing, as well as restores services such as tree trimming and recreation center hours.
2. Economic Development: I am excited about working on topics such as closing the job skills gap and promoting the San Diego/Tijuana Mega Region. I am especially looking forward to positioning San Diego as THE hub for innovation, and advancing our tech and cyber-security sectors.
3. Water Policy: I am committed to developing an affordable and sustainable water supply for our future. I am excited to work on expanding the use of grey water, as well as storm water capture and re-use.
4. Charter Review Committee: On Thursday, January 15th, the newly formed Charter Review Committee met for the first time. The goal of the committee is to bring our City's Charter into the 21st century and make it work better for both our citizens and city departments. Many sections of the Charter are outdated, confusing and contradictory and need to be corrected or updated.

In the first meeting, the committee discussed the history of Charter reform in San Diego, as well as Charter reform in other large California cities and jurisdictions, including the County of San Diego. In examining the changes made and processes used elsewhere, the Committee hopes to approach Charter revisions in San Diego in the most efficient way possible.

THE U.C. PLANNING GROUP REPORT

At the January 13 UCPG meeting, reports were given by MCAS by Col. Farnam, the police and the UCPG president. The police report covered a recent string of robberies and scams. A question was asked about the new no right on red from Regents Road to Governor; the police will refer a request for a more prominent sign to the transportation dept. The chair announced that we will have one vacant North UC resident seat on the board starting in January and an interim will be appointed.

The UCSD report listed two new projects: the Center for Novel Therapeutics on the Science Research Park and an Outpatient Pavilion to consolidate outpatient surgical services and diagnostics and physical therapy in the Health Sciences area with both projects on the East Campus.

City Council President Sherri Lightner attended and emphasized that she will be working to revise and simplify the city charter this year. She announced that Mayor Faulconer was to give the state of the city address on Thursday, January 15. It was announced that Mel Millstein from her office will be leaving but the good news is that Jamie Hoover will now be her rep. Lightner's office has always been helpful and well represented at UCPG meetings. Marty Block's representative reported on SB 15, a possible 5% tuition reduction with incentive to graduate in 4 yrs. Scott Peters' representative Hugo Carmona reported that the congressman was working on increasing jobs, making college affordable.

During the public Comment, Barry Bernstein announced a UCCA meeting on February 11 at Standley School library at 6:30 p.m. as a large community meeting on Imagine UC 2020. Joe LaCava announced that he will run for election in District 1.

An informative digital presentation was given by Caltrans on the rebuilding of the I-5 Genesee Interchange with a new wider bridge with 6 lanes and double the number of lanes on the on and off ramps, and an I-5 southbound auxiliary lane between Genesee and Sorrento Valley

Road as well as a paved bike path and bridge over Genesee on the West side of I-5. Clearing for construction will start February 15 and the project will open to traffic in 2017. Unfortunately, the January 21 meeting will not be rescheduled. You can check plans and progress on the project at KeepSanDiegoMoving.com/Genesee and see the video which was shown at the UCPG meeting as well as details of the bike paths.

Sewer repairs are being done primarily on Angell Avenue in U.C.; temporary above ground pipes will be used until completion.

The Bike Coalition of San Diego showed slides of the Rose Creek bridge planned to span the existing railroad, the planned trolley and the I-5. The bridge will be located just north of the 52/La Jolla Parkway entrance to La Jolla for bikes and pedestrians. This will be necessary since the tracks will be fenced and prevent illegal crossings. The bike path will start at Bothe, go west in San Clemente Canyon and turn north running along the railroad linking the Rose Canyon bike path with the San Clemente Canyon path with the bridge crossing from East to West. This item will be continued at the next meeting since the meeting abruptly ended when all the lights went out.

February 10th will be the next UCPG meeting in Forum Hall, above Wells Fargo Bank, UTC at 6:00 p.m. Agenda items so far are the continuation of the Rose Creek Bike path and bridge, the UC East Apartments on Genesee expansion, and the Alegria Regents Road housing development. But keep in mind that the city must approve each stage of the planning before the UCPG can vote, giving their opinion to the city council.

Changes and additions to the UCPG agenda are ongoing until required posting three days before the meeting. You can view the posted agenda at <http://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/profiles/university/agendas.shtml>



Miramar MCAS Air Controllers Update

On Thursday, January 8th, UCCA president Barry Bernstein, along with two U.C. residents familiar with jet aircraft and flight protocol, Ron Belanger and Andy Gurney, met to review with supervisory FAA air controllers AND Miramar Air Station personnel, (including the Lt. Col. in charge of air operations and two community liaisons). Barbara Blake, MTAC chairperson also was in attendance. The meeting was arranged by and held at U.S. Congressman Scott Peters' office.

The purpose was not only to serve as a neighborly reminder to those that control the air traffic and how aircraft in the area can affect our residents, but to also discuss some agreed upon specific issues. Those were; 1) the sometimes deviation of take-offs that may occur and cause unnecessary concern to residents, 2) the "distressed" aircraft that fly over when a decision to land at Miramar is made, 3) the very large fuel filled tankers that do not manage to head in the most northerly prescribed path, and 4) the preparations for the F-35, single engine jets that will be replacing the current F-18s.

That is at least the clearance a motorist should give a bicyclist when passing in the same lane. To make it easier, just change lanes.
