Only 7 cars were stolen in South U.C. this past year, while 21 were stolen the year before...Swanson Pool reopened January 25th after its ADA (American Disabilities Act) work was completed, according to pool manager, Dominic Mangiapane... Budget cuts will impact U.C. on many levels. U.C. Library on Governor will have weekly hours slashed to just 36 for 18 months beginning the new fiscal year, July 1st. Try googling your childhood library if you grew up outside San Diego and check hours of operation. Is it fair to decrease library hours again? Our U.C. library's head librarian, the talented Sheila Burnett, is out on assignment elsewhere. Why? Ask the mayor: jerrysanders@sandiego. gov. Michelle Ruiz, our youth librarian, is doing the job of the head librarian as well as her own ...Cheryl Ward, who heads Friends of the Library, reminds everyone to watch for the next U.C. Branch book sale coming in March. It is time to become a new member or renew membership in the Friends of the Library for 2010. Membership envelopes will be mailed out to current members. New members can pick up an envelope inside the U.C. library... If you have had your car axle tested due to driving into huge potholes on Governor Dr. through the Genesee intersection, thank Jesse Mays, from Sherri Lightner's staff, for reporting the need to fix these potholes to the right department. Jesse also says Genesee is scheduled to be repaved from Hwy. 52 to Governor Dr. sometime during this year. In the meantime, drive defensively... The 154 fire pits at several beaches, popular with people, are set to be

closed on July 1st to save the city \$129,500 maintenance cost a year. However, the Coastal Commission insists on a public hearing because of the great public interest. UCAA may join other community organizations in adopting a fire pit

UCCA Community Meeting on Governor/ Genesee: A Deadly Intersection

Mark your calendar for a March 11th meeting at 6 p.m. at Standley Middle School auditorium to come up with solutions to a dangerous, deadly intersection in University City at Governor and Genesee. The morning of November 9th, 2009 a fatal accident occurred when a local bicyclist, Walter Freeman, and a police car came together in a deadly accident. Each day hundreds of children cross at this busy intersection on their way to Curie Elementary School, Standley Middle School, and University City High School. University City wants to make sure pedestrians and drivers are safe. Many people have described near misses. Councilwoman Sherri Lightner, a San Diego

traffic engineer. and Community Relations Officer Alan Alvarez will be on hand to take questions and possible solutions from the community. Principals and PTSA officers have been invited to the meeting. This is not a "finger pointing" meeting, It is a

chance to ask questions and offer solutions. For example, should we implement policies like no right turns on a red light during times when traffic is heaviest during rush hours? Should we have adult volunteers on duty when school begins at Standley? Crossing guards volunteer on Edmonton adjacent to Curie, but that doesn't help people crossing on Governor. Is a pedestrian bridge feasible in this painful period of cutbacks from the city? If you have concerns or questions, email <u>slippe@san.rr.com</u>. UCCA hopes the community will come out in large numbers for this critical conversation.

Medians on Governor Drive May Need U.C. Help in July 2010

ne City budget cut involves service cuts in maintenance of medians. Planted medians on Governor Drive are located at Agee Street across from Carl's Jr., west of Radcliffe near Standley Middle School, and on the west end by Stresemann. Right now these medians are supposedly maintained by a "reimbursement from gas tax. With the reduction in median services, this gas tax funding can be used for other eligible general services such as fund existing street repairs and other work in the public right-of-way. Also, gas tax revenue may be down overall and this reduction would lessen the demands on that funding source," according to Parks and Recreation, the department that handles the maintenance of medians.

Do we want our lacaranda trees, our flowers and bushes in the medians to die? The three Governor Drive medians will be impacted these ways: all sites with gutters, hardscape, sidewalks, and pavers will no longer be swept or maintained. Sites will receive reduced frequency maintenance and inspections beginning July 1, 2010. Governor Drive (North Right-of-way Edmonton to Panel, will no longer be maintained. Safety issues, such as tree limb hazards/trip hazards, will be addressed on a reactive basis and be handled as an extra labor cost as of July 1, 2010." Regents Road, Lahitte Court to Governor Drive, curb to drainage ditch, will need attention also.

San Diego Art Gallery Owner and Arts Activist Patricia Smith Named "Local Hero" by Bank of America

Honor includes \$5,000 contribution to her charity of choice: ArtsBusXpress

University City resident Patricia Smith, owner of the Art Expressions Gallery and founder of ArtsBusXpress,

has received а Local Hero award from Bank of The America. awards showcase local heroes who champion causes vital to the well being of their communities. Local Hero Awards

are part of Bank of America's Neighborhood Excellence Initiative and include a \$5,000 contribution to the recognized nonprofit organization chosen by each recipient.

Smith's \$5,000 donation will be presented to ArtsBusXpress, a nonprofit she established to give local San Diego County students bus transportation to arts- and culture-related events. Sine 2002 the organization has served 195 schools (more than 80 percent Title 1 schools), providing transportation to more than 135,000 children to more than 175 arts and science venues.



ArtsBusXpress was the result of Smith's passion for the arts, which was sparked during a junior high school field trip she took to the San Diego Museum of Art.

> "For many children a school fieldtrip will not only be their first venture out of an economically or culturally depressedneighborhood,it will their only opportunity to hear an opera or symphony, see a ballet or live theatre, explore a museum or discover sculpture and paintings in an art gallery," said Smith.

A long-time University City community activist, Smith was instrumental in establishing Stanley Park in University City, a park that serves as the cultural hub of the whole community, and UC High School.

Smith was also acknowledged for her leadership in establishing Quilt San Diego and for her service as a longtime board member of the San Diego/Tijuana Sister Cities Society.

Smith has been recognized for her community involvement by the San Diego Unified School District, the San DiegoParks&Recreationdepartment, the Mayor of San Diego and the San Diego Visual Arts Network.

Established in San Diego's Rose Canyon in 1983, Art Expressions Galley is one of the oldest fine art galleries in San Diego. Since its inception, Smith has used to gallery to deepen the community's connection with the arts. It has been the venue for countless not-for-profit events.

On December 13, a team of UCHS Water Polo players competed in the US Navy SEAL Fitness Challenge. Out of 10 high school teams competing, UCHS placed 4th. There were 106 high school participants in this event, and each can compete in any future, national event to better their scores. 
Tt is no secret that the San Diego Unified School District is struggling with budget issues. At the request of Board of Education member, John Lee Evans, U.C. has a cluster committee composed of 6 members: Andrea Aragoza, Meagan Beale, Susan Cotsirilos, Susan Hagen, Pia Mantovani-Sud, and Clifford Weiler. The current budget deficit for SDUSD is projected to be a \$100-million.

U.C. Cluster Committee attended the January 12th School Board meeting, where they voted to base the 2010-2011 budget on the following six priorities: raising achievement levels of all students including gifted, English learners, and students with disabilities; assure a full curriculum including art, music, athletics, technical education, programs in Old Town and Balboa Park; include activities and classes that will make students competitive for college admission and eligible for U.C. system; focus on diversity, integration, school choice, such as magnet schools; provide a safe, supportive environment with vice principals, school police, counselors, nurses, and instructional supplies; maintain current class sizes; provide classroom technology to help children learn.




