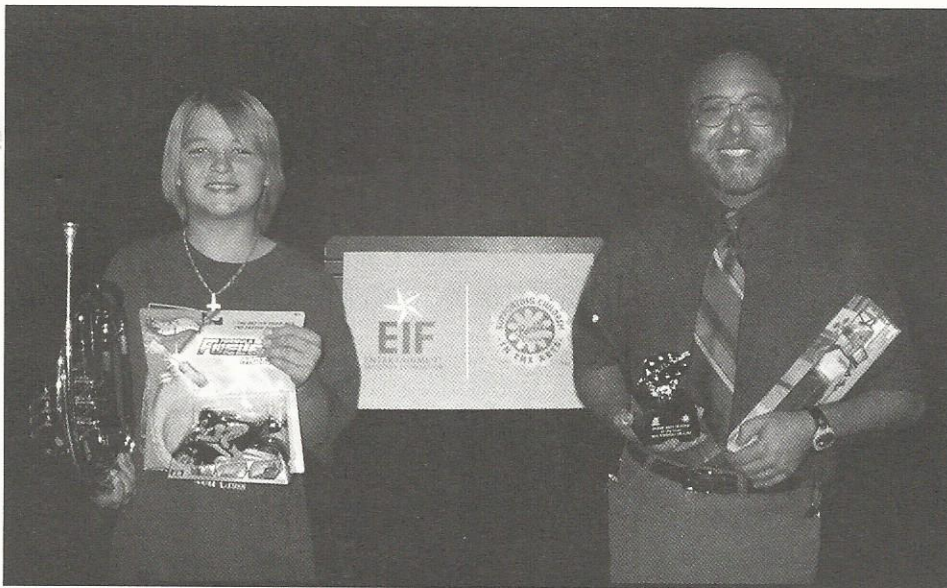

President's Perspective

Decongestion! That was the focus of the discussion at the quarterly Community Forum of the University City Community Association on Wednesday, May 12th. A fine turnout of community members gathered to voice their thoughts and opinions about ways to improve traffic flow and reduce congestion at the corner of Governor and Genesee during the before and after school hours. Ahmed Aburahmah and Husam Hasenin, Traffic Engineers from the City's transportation Engineering Division, led the discussion. Officer Ralph Cummings was most helpful and informative about the police force responsibilities at the intersection of Genesee and Governor and said he would encourage more vigilance during these peak periods. A report on traffic violations in this area has already indicated an increase in citations to offending motorists.

Daniel Arovas volunteered to chair a committee to follow up on the suggestions made and to be responsive to other positive ideas about ways to improve traffic in this area. One of the members of this committee, Zoubir Quadah, is head traffic engineer for the city of Poway and a resident of U.C. Mary Weinbrecht and ...

Prize Winning Essay Honors Music Teacher Phillip Marcus

Standley Middle School 6th grader Ricky Fox Jr. nominated talented music teacher, Phillip Marcus, for the Barbie Arts Teacher of the Year Search sponsored by Barbie and Mattel toys. Ricky's essay was chosen from over 6,000 entries. As one of 20 finalists, Mr. Marcus has already won \$5,000 for the Standley music program, and is in the running for \$10,000 first prize to be awarded in the fall. Ricky won a \$100 Mattel prize package.

Marcus. He was selected winner of the David Paul Schuchman Memorial Award as outstanding secondary music teacher of the year at the All-City Secondary Instrumental Honor Concert. Standley's advanced band won first place, superior sweepstakes and the *esprit de corps* award at Music in the Parks Festival at Magic Mountain on May 29th.

Westfield Unveils New Look for UTC

At the June UCPG meeting, Rick Froese of Westfield unveiled the new look for UTC. Site plans and renderings were viewed and discussed. All of the materials are available on a new web site established for this project at www.thenewutc.com. Westfield held an Open House to review these plans on Saturday, June 19 at Forum Hall in UTC.

Last month, Westfield announced the company's plans to substantially reduce the scope of its planned renovation of the UTC shopping center. The company has spent the last nine months meeting with University City residents and business leaders to gather feedback on the project. Based on this input, Westfield scaled back its proposed renovation substantially, eliminating a hotel, 250,000 square feet of office space and 500 residential units. The revised project now includes new retail space to accommodate public gathering areas, an expanded transit center, a cinema, bookstore, new Nordstrom and Robinson-May, and 250 apartments.

The company continues to move forward with plans for the renovation, and it has adopted guiding principles to help direct its focus. Those principles state that any renovation of UTC must 1) improve the quality of life for University City residents; 2) maintain consistency with the University City community character; and 3) contribute towards the relief of traffic congestion.

At the July UCPG meeting, the company will discuss traffic impacts and mitigations. In August, Westfield will discuss community benefits associated with renovation. 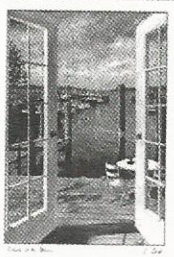

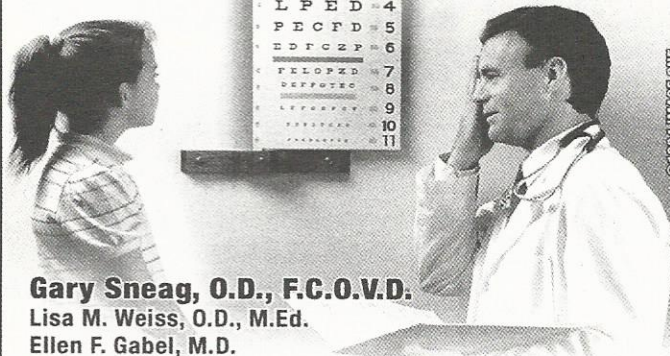


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
