IMPROVEMENTS COMING TO THE GENESEE/GOVERNOR INTERSECTION

UC Ped/Bike Safety Task Force Co-Chair ur community is making progress toward a safer intersection at Governor Drive and Genesee Avenue.

The Police Department made an immediate improvement, in the form of increased enforcement of full stops before vehicles turn right on red.

In early June, City Engineer Fred Goossens developed a set of recommendations that includes:

- signs stating "Turning Traffic Must Yield to Peds"
- straightened crosswalks that will improve sight lines
- "countdown timers" to show pedestrians how long they have to cross
- removal of median noses from the crosswalks
- ADA-compliant pedestrian ramps on the three corners that lack them

Unfortunately, funding is not available for the more expensive infrastructure improvements. Councilmember Sherri Lightner's office and our task force are looking at potential funding sources.

In addition, Mr. Goossens recommended that Standley Middle School educate its students on safe pedestrian crossing behaviors. The school has already been contacted about these ideas.

At a community meeting on June 9th, we heard clearly that the community wants longer pedestrian crossing times and lowered speeds on Genesee Ave. Currently, the



city allows less pedestrian crossing time than called for in federal guidelines. We're still in negotiation on this point. City Engineer Steve Denny told us there is no practical way to lower speeds on Genesee, but we're hoping to return to this issue in the future.



Improving safety on Genesee will be a long-term effort, but we've made a good start.

Water Conservation is Mandatory

ffective June 1, 2009, San Diego declared a Level 2 Drought Alert. Level 2 includes many mandatory water restrictions. In addition, all voluntary Level 1 conservation practices became mandatory. The Level 1 & 2 restrictions include, but is not limited to the following:

Landscape irrigation is limited to no more than three assigned days per week. Those days are: Homes with odd-numbered addresses can water: Sunday, Tuesday & Thursday Homes with even-numbered addresses can water: Saturday, Monday & Wednesday Apartments, Condos and Businesses can water: Monday, Wednesday & Friday



ten minutes maximum per watering station per assigned day

(does not apply to drip, micro-irrigation, stream rotor, rotary heads, hose end sprinklers with timers or valves operated by a weather-based irrigation controller). All irrigation is banned while it is raining. Customers cannot use a running hose to wash down sidewalks, driveways, parking areas, tennis courts, patios or other paved areas, except to alleviate immediate safety or sanitation hazards unless that hose is connected to a water efficient device such as a commercial water broom. Restaurants and other food establishments shall only serve and refill water for patrons upon request.

These restrictions are permanent and are now in place year-round. San Diego residents are encouraged to report water waste by calling the Water Hotline at (619) 515-3500. For more information go to
