Working for You

I am working hard on next year's city budget. I remain committed to ending fire engine brownouts and maintaining library and rec center hours. I am also working to improve lifeguard staffing and training.

While I work on the budget, I remain focused on neighborhood issues. You may have noticed that the stoplight on Governor and Greenwich would turn red, even without cross traffic — the result of a broken pavement sensor. After hearing from constituents, I worked with the Streets Division to expedite the repairs, which are now complete.

University City United Church members contacted me about an unsightly construction staging site on the far west end of Governor. The site had been an eyesore for almost 20 months. I worked with city Undergrounding staff to clean up the site, and the contractor has since completed the removal of all materials.

Resurfacing of Genesee between Governor and the 52 had been impeded by lack of funding and a need for a permit from Caltrans. I worked with the city's Streets Division to identify funding and with Caltrans to expedite required permits. Now drivers have a smooth ride from Governor Drive to Appleton Street.

The large, unattractive medians on Genesee and Regents, stretching north from 52 to Governor Drive, are showing their age. It is very doubtful that the City of San Diego has or will have the funds to upgrade/improve what is a community "eyesore." The next time you are driving these main access roads, please take a close look and think about their appearance and impression it leaves upon visitors, and how poorly it represents our University City neighborhood. CAN'T WE DO BETTER? Below are some possible solutions for you to consider:

1. The City of San Diego has a process called a Maintenance Assessment District. This would be similar to the Standley Park Rec. Center assessment utilized way back in the '70s. In this case, each homeowner in South U.C. would have tacked onto their yearly tax bill, a pre-determined amount of money for a number of years. This process

now requires a petition with no less than 30% of homeowners' approval, followed by a vote conducted by the City of San Diego. Currently we are working with the city departments to obtain a cost estimate for each household.

2. Seeking a waiver from the city, and using a list of city approved contractors to bid out the project. This may cost less. However, a billing process would have to be determined, as well as establishing an ongoing management board.
3. Identifying U.C. "angels" to donate the monies needed and create a philanthropic U.C. Beautification fund. Donors could choose to have plaques/signage reflecting their investment in our community on the medians, similar to signage seen on highways.

Are You Curbing Your Dog? *By Angela Neste*

The sidewalk on the east side of Gullstrand between the Tula cul-de-sac and Governor runs next to the canyon. It consistently has deposits which show that owners do not curb their dogs. Ironically, the sidewalk on the west side of the same stretch of street does not have this problem. My guess is that dog walkers assume that since the east side of the sidewalk does not run in front of people's houses, it is not necessary to pick up after their

dogs. However, many people, like me, use the east side of the street for their exercise walk. I prefer walking on that side of the road because I do not have to contend with the traffic at the Robbins T-section, or people driving in or out of their driveways. What I do have to watch out for and avoid are the dog 'deposits'.

This is a reminder to curb one's dog when walking on that section of sidewalk, as they do on other streets. Thanks.

HEADS-UP TO ALL WALKERS!

1. When walking alone, be aware of your surroundings and observant of everything around you.
2. Don't text while walking. This gives thieves the opportunity to take items from you such as cell phones and iPods when you are not paying attention.
3. Don't have jewelry showing. For instance, place your necklace inside your shirt.
4. Hang on to your backpacks.
5. Don't give a thief an opportunity to take anything from you.
 - a. Don't let anyone enter your personal space:
 - b. Intimate space: 1 to 1.5 feet
 - c. Personal space: 1.5 to 4 feet
 - d. Social space: 4 to 12 feet
 - e. Public space: 12 or more feet
6. Trust your thoughts.
7. If someone asks for the time, keep on walking.
8. Stay away from the curb so someone cannot grab you from a passing car.
9. Vary your route.
10. Carry a flashlight at night.
11. Know your location.
12. If you are attacked, DO SOMETHING! Never let that person take you to a secondary location.
13. AVOID walking alone.
14. AVOID alleys.
15. AVOID stairwells.
16. Don't overload yourself with packages. Do not allow your attention to be distracted from your purse or packages.
17. If you carry a purse, keep it close to your body, the flap toward your body. If there is a strap, carry the purse across your body. If you are wearing a coat/jacket, put the coat over the purse strap.
18. If possible, carry keys and wallet on your person, in your pockets.
19. If you are dropped off by a taxi, ask the driver to wait until you are inside.
20. If you are waiting for a ride, wait in a busy, well-lit place.
21. If you suspect someone is following you, cross the street and/or walk into an open business.


But the baseball season isn't really over...time for All Stars






Rally for Beloved Spreckels Teachers By Claire Shaughnessy

Spreckels teachers and parents held an energetic rally outside the bilingual magnet school on Governor Drive to draw attention to drastic budget cuts that may mean the loss of five beloved teachers at Spreckels Elementary School. Wearing red and waving signs that read, "No Layoffs," "No Despidos," parents, students and teachers demonstrated to garner attention to their fight as community members and citizens showed support by joining in, honking horns and waving. Erin Nordlow has assumed the role of Poster Teacher for this cause and is the main subject of a Facebook page, Rescind Ms Nordlow's Pink Slip NOW, created by parents, that advocates for keeping doomed teachers Erin Nordlow, Betty Nava, Sara Bobier, Abby Murad and Emily Ashlock at their school. Spreckels Elementary Academy of Bilingual Studies also is at the mercy of threatened district and state budget cuts to busing. At the June 3rd School Board Meeting, board members plan to decide whether to cut funding to transportation. If they do, hundreds of underprivileged students attending Spreckels may lose their opportunity to continue learning in a safe, culturally integrated, bilingual environment.



Spreckels School Garden Club By Sandy Lippe


