


The Care and Feeding of Our Park...



One of the many groups enjoying our park on a weekday evening.


Standley Park faces a funding crisis which has several residents and most particularly the people who care for the park a little upset. Mayor Sanders has proposed pooling all employees who deal with park maintenance into a General Services Department from which they can be drawn on for work on any of the cities' parks. It is the Mayor's belief that this will streamline the operation, make it more efficient and therefore result in a cost saving. We have already seen the effect of cost saving measures here in UC when the decision was made to close the pool from February 19th to the

weekend prior to Memorial Day. The people who are not in favor of this move argue that, while on paper, this might look like a good idea with welcome cost savings, it will dispense with some devoted employees who care for our park and with whom the community has a relationship. As a result of this relationship the care provided is of a higher level than we could expect of employees from a pool who are arbitrarily assigned to care for our park. Another downside is that the needs of our park would be prioritized on a list and naturally, be dealt with according to the level of urgency of that need.






