n March 11th at 6 p.m. in the Standley Middle School media center, UCCA hopes to see you there. Why? Governor and Genesee, the deadly intersection, the site of a November 2009 fatal accident of a bicyclist, needs to hear your concerns and possible solutions so that no children on their way to school will become the next victims of a traffic No interest because you don't have small children? No excuse. "There's too much apathy around here, but who cares?" was a statement recently heard around U.C. residents should be concerned about the dangers to others maneuvering that busy intersection. This is an opportunity to make a difference for the community you call home.

UCCA has gathered a panel of people who influence public policy: Councilwoman Sherri Lightner, Board of Education representative John Lee Evans, Policemen Alan Alvarez and Lt. Brian Blagg, City of San Diego traffic engineer Fred Goossens. They will address your concerns, your solutions. Do we need a different timing of lights? A pedestrian bridge? Crossing guards? EARLY LITERACY COMPUTERS FOR NU BRANCH LIBRARY

door opened to a lifetime of learning for children on 19 January 2010 when the North University Community Branch Library (NU) inaugurated the use of 2 Early Literacy Computer Workstations. Just fifteen minutes after the library opened, the workstations were swamped with curious children.



Two workstations were purchased for the library with a community fund-raising drive, matching funds from the Friends of NU Library and matching funds from the City of San Diego. NU Branch Library is only the third branch library in the SDPL system to offer these Early Literacy Computer Workstations. The workstations are made by AWE (Advanced Workstations in Education) located in Chester, PA.

These workstations make it possible for

children, age two through ten, to explore and learn using a variety of educational

tools. Each station carries programs chosen for age appropriateness, educational value, ease of use, entertainment value, graphics and sound as well as discovery and growth. It couldn't be easier; the children simply move the cursor over an icon to HEAR and SEE what exciting programs can be found. Little or no adult intervention is required.



Branch Manager, Cyndy Shutler, said "These workstations not only encourage

children to read and learn and can be used to develop foreign language skills. Children are already exposed to high tech gadgets, so these Early Literacy Computers are simply the next step in their educational development. Much of the content is aligned to national and California educational standards. We are so thrilled to have these workstations for our young patrons."

Jf your neighbor is violating a city code, you have some recourse. First, you need to call the person in violation and discuss how the problem affects you. Give some possible solutions. If after a fair amount of time, nothing happens, you can contact Code Compliance at 619-238-2400. Community initiated complaints usually get a higher priority

than individual ones. You might encourage your neighbors to join you in making phone calls to Code Compliance the same day. Another suggestion from the City of San Diego is contacting the Mediation Center at 619-238-2400

San Clemente Terrace Development by Judy Bethel

proposal is working its way through the city permitting process to allow building on the slope between Soderblom Ave and San Clemente Terrace. Newland Communities has submitted a plan to build five homes of about 2800 square feet; each would have reduced depth and would be situated on wide lots. This 1.6 acre, 35 degree slope has been considered open space since the completion of the development of San Clemente Terrace Estates in the mid 1970s. The status of the parcel is in dispute, and the city is tasked with deciding whether the land can legally be developed.

Newland Communities informally presented their plan before the University City Planning Group last July. Homeowners were advised by the city of the plan Jan 31, 2009 and have subsequently met with the developer according to UCPG instructions. The meeting occurred on Jan 20, 2010 to explain the details of the project.

Several questions remain open for discovery. One is the composition of the soil on the slope, its seepage, and its stability when approximately 3000 tons of earth are removed. San Clemente Terrace was built for residences on one side only. Parking concerns and a 40% increase in daily traffic will need to be addressed. Habitat destruction is a concern because of the presence of burrowing owls and other birds, raccoon, skunk, and fox. All are found living in the brush and keeping the ecosystem in balance. Appropriate revegetation is an issue for neighbors living on Soderblom.



Decisions regarding this parcel must be done with great care to maintain the quality of life of this neighborhood and the spirit of the community plan.

Local Students Receive a Free "Ride to the Arts" Courtesy of ArtsBusXpress

rtsBusXpress, a local nonprofit venture that provides bus grants for classroom field trips to arts and science venues is going strong. Since the first bus was launched in October 2002, ArtsBusXpress has provided field trip transportation to over 142,000

San Diego School Children.

San Diego is blessed with over 100 arts and science culture venues that offer free or nominal admission to special children's programs.

Unfortunately, budget crises in the schools have left not only arts programs but school buses on the chopping block. Without transportation, there is no access and children are unable to take advantage of outside enrichment.

ArtsBusXpress is the missing link that connects classrooms with the rich array of possibilities San Diego offers. Teachers in San Diego City Schools can go to the web site and request a Bus Grant to take their students on life changing fieldtrips.

ArtsBusXpress began as an unprecedented collaboration of the San Diego – Tijuana Sister cities Society, San Diego Unified School District, San Diego Arts Education Partnership, City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture and the Community Council for Music in the schools.

The program is the brainchild of long time University City resident, Patricia Smith, owner of Art Expressions Gallery, who credits a high school field trip to the San Diego Museum of Art for piquing her interest in fine arts.

"For many children school fieldtrips are their only opportunity to hear an opera or symphony, see a ballet or live theatre, explore a museum or discover sculpture and paintings in an art gallery – and ArtsBusXpress targets those children," said Smith.

While bus transportation is financially out of reach for many schools, it is surprisingly affordable. Most bus transportation cost just \$175.

\$360. to send 65 - 100 children to a memorable experience.

"And children aren't the only winners, said Smith. "The entire arts community benefits by nurturing future arts patrons. Today's children will be tomorrow's decision makers, and the future of our cultural institutions rests in their hands. How will they value what they have never experienced?"

While ArtsBusXpress has been supported by major foundations, over the years, the program builds its' momentum through the support of local businesses, community organizations and individuals. The major supporters include: Qualcomm, Inc., the San Diego Union-Tribune, Viejas Band of Kumeyaay Indians, The Century Club of San Diego, The Burnham Foundation, the Dickenson Foundation, and Price Charities.

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
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
