

#### UC resident heads Rose Creek watershed project

U.C. resident Ann Van Leer is project manager of the Rose Creek Watershed Opportunities Assessment led by San Diego Earthworks. This \$365,000 project is funded primarily by the Coastal Conservancy with funds from Supervisor Pam Slater-Price and additional support from the City of San Diego. The Rose Creek watershed extends from Miramar MAS to Mission Bay, including Rose and San Clemente Canyons. The project will create a comprehensive assessment of opportunities to improve the watershed in biological resources, such as the removal of invasive species and restoration with native species, historical resources with educational displays and recreational opportunities, new trails and linking existing trails. Perry Meyer is a fine art print dealer specializing in 18th-20th century works on paper with an emphasis on Latin and surrealistic art. He had just taken his thirteen-year-old son, Benjamin to get his broken wrist set by the doctor before settling in for coffee and conversation at Java City in the Marketplace.

Perry and Kathi Meyer have called U.C. their home for over fourteen years. Kathi, with a Masters degree in marine biology, works as a data analyst for Ligand Pharmaceuticals in Genesee Science Park. She encourages Perry in his Mister Mom role and in his career as an artist/art dealer. Elicia, their seventeen-year-old daughter, a senior at San Diego Charter School in UTC, was just accepted into Cal State San Marcos. Both Kathi and Perry take great pride in their kids. Perry served on the Mesa Soccer Board of Directors and also on the Standley Recreation Council, Since Perry works out of his house, he can keep an eve on the kids.

Linkabit and private art for the Irwin Jacobs family, founders of Qualcomm. He has placed art collections in many other private homes and corporations like IBM and Motorola. "I have contacts for any art," Perry says. "I love to help people and teach them about art as they collect pieces."

A typical day for Meyer has him on the Internet or working from the many referrals he receives from people seeking art collections. "I sell art I like. I don't like all saleable art. In some of the galleries you get sales people who promote gimmicky, commercial work. I love to work with people who want to buy fine art, who want to learn. My excitement goes to someone with questions, with that desire to learn and collect fine art. For example, I've been working for thirteen years on a private collection for an eighty-year-old woman in the Midwest. She is putting together a collection for a college. I've never met her. She was a referral. Today I got her a Matisse. It gives me such an adrenaline rush to look for art for her. Before the Internet I used to make photocopies to show her the work. The Internet has opened new opportunities for art dealers like me. On the other hand, sometimes the Internet has hurt the art business. We art dealers are like travel agents. Dealers are educated and develop reputations. The Internet provides accessibility to compete, but some people, who claim to be art dealers, have not done their homework. Uneducated buyers can get burned. However, in my twenty-seven years as an art dealer, I have a tremendous contact base worldwide."

Perry is a Chicago native who moved to Point Loma at age seventeen. He graduated from Point Loma High and studied at Mesa and U.S.I.U. He worked on scenic design for Starlight, built sets for the Old Globe and for the San Diego Opera. His own art includes sculpting, etchings, drawing, and painting. Perry loves to return to Chicago for the Chicago Art Fair at Navy Pier in May and to New York City for the numerous art auctions.

Kathi and Perry Meyer have teamed up to make a nice life with their children. Kathi's father-in-law is graphic artist, Howard Koslow, designer of the lighthouse stamp, the Brooklyn Bridge stamp, and the 40's stamps. If you would like to talk about art, you can find Perry at Java City, sipping coffee and holding court before going to work in his house. His energy, enthusiasm, knowledge, and experience make you want to start your own fine art collection.
