CHALLENGER BASEBALL PROGRAM GIVES BACK TO ALL PLAYERS

The Challenger program is Little League's adaptive baseball program for individuals with physical and developmental challenges. Participants enjoy the sport of baseball in a fun, safe, and friendly environment. Dan Harvey managed the team from 2003-2015. The new manager is Rob Dreher (former head coach of Clairemont High Baseball).

Recently, the University City High School baseball team players have volunteered their time to be "buddies" to the Challenger players. In Challenger games, buddies help their challenged partners by acting as guides around the base paths, assisting with fielding and batting. The home team provides buddies for the visiting team as well. The UCHS baseball team have also invited fellow high school Challenger players to come to their games because, they've learned that everyone just wants to "play ball."

Come watch the remaining Challenger home games at Standley Park, softball field next to Standley Middle School, on Saturdays April 30 (with UCHS Varsity Team), and May 21, both at 9:00am, and the All-Star Games on June 18 starting at 1:00pm. 



It's May and that means that the City's budget process is underway. In mid-April, Mayor Faulconer released a proposed budget for the 2017 fiscal year. When I first took office, the Council had to make difficult cuts to services and it is great to see how far we have come since then. I encourage anyone interested in participating in the process to attend the public Budget Review Committee meetings to provide feedback. The meetings will take place May 4, 5, 9 and 10 at 9:00am and 2:00pm on the 12th floor of the City Administration Building located at 202 C Street. There will also be an evening meeting for members of the public unable to attend the morning and afternoon meetings on May 16 at 6:00pm. The final budget will be voted on by City Council during the week of June 13. This is your opportunity to tell us what you would like to see the City's resources allocated to.

Fast Response Squad 56 has been in operation for a little over three months now and already there has been a reduction in response times. I'm sure you are all welcoming the crew to the neighborhood with goodies, hopefully not too many!

Earlier in the year, our office received complaints about odors from the Miramar Landfill. The City's Environmental Services Department has been working diligently to resolve the odor issues. If you experience any nuisance odors you believe may be connected to the landfill, please notify the Air Pollution control District at 858.586.2650 or contact our office and we can forward your complaint on to the correct staff at the City.

I-5/Genesee Avenue Interchange Project Nearing Halfway Completion Mark

A great deal has been achieved since the Interstate 5 (I-5)/Genesee Avenue Interchange Project began in February 2015. Over the past year, crews have focused on building the north side of the new bridge, started work on 12 retaining walls surrounding the interchange, and began construction on a special new feature – a separated bike path along the west side of I-5.

Over the next few months, crews will complete the north side of the bridge and Caltrans will switch traffic to the new bridge. Then the existing bridge will be demolished and the south side of the bridge will be built. Please watch for future e-blasts, follow us on social media, or check the project webpage for updates on the traffic switch.

Throughout 2016, crews will continue work on the retaining walls around the interchange, as well as the bike path. The three-year project will replace the existing Genesee Avenue bridge with a ten-lane structure that will include additional vehicle lanes, bike lanes, sidewalks, and will better accommodate current and future travel demands in one of the most congested and job-intensive corridors in San Diego County.

This \$105.2 million project is funded through a combination of federal, state, and regional TransNet revenue sources, and partnerships with City of San Diego and UC San Diego.



“Blank Out No Turn On Red” Sign at Regents Road

City of San Diego Transportation Engineers recently installed a new signage at Regents Road and Governor Drive. It is called a “Blank Out no Turn On Red” sign that will be activated by pedestrians pushing the pedestrian crossing signal button. This new digital sign replaces the previous signage that was in place. When the no turn on red sign is illuminated, drivers are prohibited from turning right. When the sign is not illuminated, a right turn is permitted after a complete stop and when safe to continue.

HOW TO REPORT BUILDING AND LAND USE VIOLATIONS

Requests to investigate alleged building and/or land use violations of the San Diego Municipal Code on private property [such as noise, land development, building code, housing, weeds, signs, zoning] can be delivered to the City of San Diego office of Code Enforcement Division via regular mail, or presented at the office reception counter.

In general, complainant name, address and telephone number remain confidential unless case records are subpoenaed or the complainant is willing to be a participant in mediation; however complaints involving noise issues will frequently require complainant disclosure.

Note: Community-initiated complaints will usually receive a higher priority than individual complaints. Online requests can be made at www.sandiego.gov/ced/report/investigation.shtml.

VANDALISM:

WHAT IS IT AND WHAT SHOULD YOU DO ABOUT IT

"Vandalism is the willful, malicious destruction, damage or defacement of property."

A few examples of this can be graffiti, posting signs on private property fences without permission, damaging or destroying someone's landscaping, breaking into a car or emptying trash on someone's lawn.

How to prevent: Install LED lights, monitor security cameras, lock side gates, post a "private property" sign, report damage to the police non-emergency number 619-531-2000, teach children to value other's property and participate in your Neighborhood Watch group.



Do Not Trespass on Miramar!

MCAS Miramar has increased base security and enforcement of trespassing of federal property east of the I-805. While there is a small amount of open space between the I-805 and Miramar's boundary, hikers and bicyclists are known to travel well beyond the boundary and into federal property. While there are fences and signs that mark the federal property boundary, these are often torn down. Trespassers in this area do present security concerns for MCAS Miramar.

There is also a substantial amount of vandalism and damage that is being done to the VA Cemetery. A network of illegal trails has been built in one of the phased plans for the VA Cemetery. This has resulted in a considerable amount of environmental damage, with estimates as high as \$300,000. There have also been instances of bikers coming out of the canyon and coming close to funeral services that are in progress.

UC Planning Group Report

There was no April UCPG meeting so I thought I would give you a quick update on the March 29 SANDAG meeting at Nobel Rec. Center and a preview of things to come on the May agenda for UCPG.

At the March meeting of UCPG, SANDAG reported that they were in the process of issuing "Resolutions of Necessity" to take land for the trolley right of way, taking the minimum amount of sq. ft. and pricing the property. Much of this land involves La Jolla Colony and will affect Barcelona, La Paz, Irvine Co., Scripps, as well as land in the CA Pizza Kitchen area. There was a meeting at Doyle Recreation Center on March 29 to discuss the impact on those living in the area. The meeting was too well attended. It was in a small meeting room that was so crowded and noisy that one could not even see the plans that SANDAG displayed on tables around the room. This was supposed to be an information meeting for the La Jolla Colony residents and owners since the trolley line will come between I-5 and Charmant Drive. The trolley people did not anticipate such a crowd. Therefore, UCPG has asked SANDAG to come to the May meeting and show the trolley route video so that people can see the planned route and answer questions. As of today, we have not had an answer as to whether they can attend. I will post on Nextdoor.com and the UCCA website on any updates.

"The Trolley extension route begins just north of the Old Town Transit Center and travels in existing railroad right-of-way and alongside Interstate 5 to Gilman Drive. It crosses to the west side of I-5 just south of Nobel Drive and continues on to the UCSD campus, crosses back to the east side of I-5 near Voigt Drive to serve the UCSD east campus and Scripps Memorial Hospital, transitions into the median of Genesee Avenue, and continues down Genesee Avenue to the Westfield UTC transit center."—Quoted from sandag.org. For more on the trolley and a map check their website sandag.org under "projects, public transit, Mid-Coast Trolley."

The UCPG sub-committee on the Costa Verde renovation has had one meeting with the developer and the architect and we will continue to meet for the next two years.

The other agenda items presently set for the May meeting are: 1) Update from Westfield UTC on the next phase in their planning, 2) Scripps Research Institute expansion and 3) Spectrum Campus Pointe phases 3 and 4.

Miramar Landfill Update

The Miramar Landfill has proudly served the greater San Diego community for many decades. This 1,500-acre facility accepts nearly 900 million tons of municipal solid waste for disposal annually along with approximately 100,000 tons of green waste including 10,000 tons of food waste at our compost facility.

Since the opening of the Miramar Landfill in 1959, the City has received a limited number of odor-related complaints regarding the Miramar facilities. However, the amount of complaints received through the winter months in 2016 are higher than previously received. We take these odor issues very seriously and are working diligently alongside our regulators and adjacent communities to identify the exact sources so we can implement successful solutions to eliminate them.

Since February, we have modified the compost pile mixing procedure to eliminate mixing the compost on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays to minimize potential odor contact by the community. We also changed the mix ratio between the food waste-to-greens waste thereby reducing the density of each compost pile to reduce the potential odor concentration during mixing. The finished compost pile was returned to processing piles for additional mixing.

City staff have also conducted multiple community sweeps in several neighborhoods at similar times to the complaints to try and identify the odor and its source. The current monitoring efforts have shown a significant reduction in complaints in recent weeks. Future odor complaints should be submitted to the APCD at 858.586.2650. Additionally, we request you also contact the Miramar Landfill Program Manager (Mark zu Hone) directly at 858.518.3008 or at mzuhone@sandiego.gov. City staff will immediately be sent to the location of the complaint to attempt to identify the source of the odor. Additional information is posted on the UCCA website at universitycitynews.org.



Mozart Music for Winds at University City United Church

On May 22 an ensemble of current and former members of the La Jolla Symphony orchestra will perform Mozart's Serenade 10 ("Gran Partita") for 13 players. The program will begin at 7:00pm and will last for about one hour; the concert is a benefit for the UCUC music program. May 22 is "Music Appreciation Sunday" at UCUC; it seemed appropriate to end it with such a program.

Mozart's Serenade 10 was written in 1781-82, soon after Mozart arrived in Vienna. It is a wonderful example of music for an ensemble of winds, called a Harmonie during Mozart's lifetime. Such ensembles became popular in the last half of the 18th century, and only lost popularity when austerity brought about by the Napoleonic wars led their patrons to cut back on expenses. In that era music could not be recorded and played back at a later time; if you wanted music you either had to play it yourself or bring in a group of musicians to create the music in real time. Aristocrats might have their own Harmonie; others would hire such an ensemble for special events such as parties or dinners. Mozart wrote at least 12 Serenades for such ensembles; Serenade 10 is by far the most elaborate of these, and calls for an unusually large Harmonie ensemble, consisting of pairs of oboes, clarinets, basset horns, bassoons, two pairs of horns and contrabass—13 players in all.

This masterpiece is not performed as often as it deserves, perhaps due to its instrumentation (basset horns are not very common today) and length. This performance is an opportunity for us all to delight in Mozart at his best. Please come, and bring others who are interested!

The OMC Classic Choir and the La Jolla Presbyterian Church Choir will give a combined concert featuring "The Mass of St. Cecelia" by J.E. Turner and "A Gospel Mass" by Robert Ray. Plus a special anthem "He Never Failed Me Yet" also by Robert Ray. A reception will follow the concert.

She started shelving books in the Curie Library and would place her then 2 ½ year old son on the floor and load him up with books. When her daughter joined Daisy's/Brownies, she volunteered with field trips, as cookie mom, campouts and so much more. When John started Kindergarten, and with two kids in school full time, her volunteering took a life of its own. Lil found ways to help out any way she could. She joined the SSC, worked in classrooms, helped with book fairs, jog-a-thons, school plays, craft fair, room mom, boys scouts, and even picketed to save the UC Library from closing.

As her kids got older at Curie, and she was one of the experienced moms, newer moms asked what she was doing – making copies – and asked if they could help.
