
Being a Neighborhood Watch Captain is a wise decision, listen to the feedback:

The benefits I have experienced with meeting over 40 families in our neighborhood has given me a better sense of community. Crime prevention is a community

effort and there is safety in numbers. - Vicky



The most profound benefit was that we now have an annual block party and everybody in the neighborhood gets to know each other. Secondly, having a neighborhood group email in which important and valuable information is disseminated is very helpful. - Gary

Neighbors appreciate being informed and once you have set up the group email, Barbara does all the work, and you just forward all of her great information. It is a VERY EASY JOB. -Mary

Although I have lived in the same house for many years, I did not know my neighbors. Through Neighborhood Watch, I have enjoyed reaching out and connecting. — Don D.

I am proud to be a Neighborhood Watch Captain. It's a lifeline, a communication link and great way to keep your neighborhood safer and informed and most families want to be included in the process; it's easy and free! It's like circling the wagons, where everyone's got your back; looking out for all our neighbors. People have very busy lives, children with after school activities moms and dads working long hours; I feel that what I do may help ease some of the added worries people may have by educating them to recognize suspicious activity. — Madeline (She has been involved for the past 30 years and became more active when we rebooted the old Neighborhood Watch.)

I have been a resident of UC for 25 years and the Neighborhood Watch Captain for over two years. I find it very rewarding as a community member by keeping an eye out for things happening on our street and surrounding area. The budget includes over \$100 million for road repair, and \$4.7 million for improved recruitment and retention for police officers and 911 dispatchers while recreation center hours have been expanded to be at the highest level in a decade.

ELECTION RESULTS - JUNE 7 PRIMARY

City Council District 1

Barbara Bry and Ray Ellis, the top two vote getters, will be on the November ballot. Ms. Bry, who had her campaign headquarters in University City, received nearly 50% of the vote in the primary. Both candidates have confirmed their intent to participate in the UCCA/League of Women Voter's Forum on Wednesday, October 5 at University City High School.

San Diego City Schools Board of Education

Incumbent and U.C. resident, **Dr. John Lee Evans**, overwhelmed his opponent Stephan Groce in the June 7 Primary, receiving over 70% of the vote. They will be in a citywide run-off in November. Dr. Evans has been an integral part of the planning for Imagine UC 2020.

San Diego County Board of Education

Mark Powell, long time University City resident, educator, volunteer, (as well as Golden Triangle's Realtor of the Year), won a position on the County Board of Education.

This is a joint use project between San Diego Unified and the City of San Diego. It is in the Mayor's plan and the Board of Education's plan for 30 additional joint use projects across the city in the next few years.


Continental crosswalk markings are up to 24 inches wide and installed parallel to vehicular travel. They are the new standard in San Diego because research has shown that they are more visible to motorists and pedestrians. The continental style enhances public safety by providing clear demarcation and reduces vehicle trespassing into the crosswalk.

The City's Transportation Department says the new crosswalks at Governor and Genesee will be installed over the summer; hopefully before school starts in August.

Community Volunteer Ed Rubenstein Advocates for Foster Youth

Community volunteer and UC resident, Ed Rubenstein, has served as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (a CASA) with Voices for Children for nearly seven years. His wife had encouraged him to apply when she heard about the need on the radio. Ed's own children were grown, and he says, "I thought about how much I could give."

No special experience is required to volunteer; all the training needed is provided. In fact, Ed's background couldn't be further from the foster care field. He owned and operated



his own advertising and marketing agency in UC for 28 years, until retiring one year ago.

CASAs, like Ed, work one-on-one with a child or group of siblings in foster care. They get to know the children, gather important information from reports and professionals, and advocate for the children's best interests. These children have been abused, abandoned, or neglected and removed from their homes. Ed notes it can be challenging and that "the 'emotional roller coaster' of the issues is very difficult." However, the rewards make up for it, and Ed reflects on being able to "see the progress that has been made with the child—I feel good knowing that I was able to afford the child a better way of looking at the future."

University City was master planned, along with UCSD and the Salk Institute, to service the developing scientific and intellectual nexus in the north of San Diego.

An early developer at the time was Irvin J. Kahn, whose vision was to create an affordable tract development with quality, architectural housing instead of the cheap, soulless housing developments of the time in places like Clairemont and Ocean Park. Kahn commissioned architect William Krisel to design the University City tract in 1960.

Krisel's pioneering work in development of architectural features such as the butterfly roof, concrete shadow block and the residential clerestory were all prototyped in University City. These design features would become signatures of his work and inspire his peers as well as residents of his signature homes.

So take a look around the neighborhood and enjoy a piece of architectural history. Better yet, if you own one of these houses, take a moment to look at some of the details that separate it from the houses around you. And if you have the heart, consider restoring it to its original glory as a concrete symbol of a different time.

Editor's note: John Mares, AIA RIBA, is an architect in Los Angeles, grew up in University City and whose parents still live in UC. Mares found out about the Krisel designed homes when he attended a dinner at USC honoring William Krisel. At the dinner, Mares recognized the homes and realized Krisel had designed the midcentury modern homes in University City from which he was familiar. To view other pictures and read the entire

To minimize or preclude adverse impacts on the environment, it works with the community planning groups to ensure environmental mitigation to any adverse impacts to the environment.

Supplemental UCPG Report UCCA President Barry Bernstein was at the June UCPG meeting and submits the following report:

At the Tuesday, June 14 meeting, the main focus was the discussion revolving around the preliminary University Community Plan traffic amendment to remove the Regents Road Bridge and Genesee widening from the University Community Plan. The larger, more comprehensive draft EIR was expected to be released by June 17. Portions of the draft EIR will include the exclusion/inclusion of the Regents Rd Bridge/and Genesee widening to meet future traffic mitigation in University City. Dan Monroe, San Diego city planner representative, led the discussion. UCPG is expecting a great deal of discussion on this document at their July 12 meeting and has assembled committees to review the draft EIR, as well as to review the various builder's fees accumulated over the past years. These monies could be used to fund any recommendations forthcoming from the San Diego City Council, which will vote on recommendations later this calendar year. If you are planning on attending the July 12 meeting, it is recommended to arrive early for seating. *The draft EIR can be reviewed on line, and is also being made available for review at our local public libraries.

Standley Park Facelift

Standley Park has been undergoing a 'mini facelift'! Natashia Pierre became the Center Director March 2015 and the facelift began in May 2015. Many projects have been completed, several are in process and there is also a 'to do — wish list'! The process has been facilitated by Area Director Johnny Chou, the supervision of Natashia Pierre, completed by the City or Center staff and with the support and backing of the Board of Directors (B/D) of the Park and Recreation Council.

The completed projects include: painting of the exterior trim and complete painting of the interior (by the City), ceiling tiles replaced (City, fundedby B/D), new signage (City), Gazebo painted (Center Staff), play equipment inspected (Contractor) and items replaced (City), planters cleaned (Staff) and new bark spread (provided by the City, work by the Staff), Lobby furniture (funded by B/D, assembled by Staff), canyon area behind Center cleaned and the encampment removed (CCC).

Projects in process include: new counters throughout the Center, the long-awaited Marquee and an upgraded PA system (all funded by the B/D). Work requests have been submitted for new baseboards and the replacement of the damaged skylight. And the ever growing 'to do — wish list' includes: additional drought tolerant plantings, additional kitchen upgrades, replacement and upgrade of parts of the play equipment. The Recreation Center was dedicated in 1978. It will continue to need the TLC that the City, the wonderful Staff and the UC Community is providing!

STEAM Workshops in University City for Girls




