Hi Everyone -

It's time to join UCCA for 2018...Please be careful when you remove the staples and send-in your membership form...note that this year, if you feel so inclined, that in addition to your choice of membership category/payment you can donate an **additional** amount to a particular UCCA-sponsored event. Thank you in advance for supporting UCCA's efforts in making University City, "more than just a neighborhood."

The Fall/Winter "holiday" season is beginning, and based on last year's wet winter, it might be time for clearing out roof gutters, repairing possible roof leaks, and getting the hot chocolate ready for the cooler evenings. The Aztec football team is having one of their best winning seasons so far, and the University City High School team is also doing very well. Major League Baseball's World Series has started and when games are being played in November, weather may become a factor. It will be the American League Champions, Houston Astros versus the National League's Los Angeles Dodgers in the World Series. The consensus is that Vince Skully, the recently retired voice of the Dodgers, will NOT be doing any guest play-by-play announcing. And in case you missed the "Breeder's Cup" at Del Mar, remember the Bing Crosby session continues until the end of the month.

As you know, the Westfield, UTC mall will be opening some of their specialty stores/restaurants this month, as the construction of their high-rise apartment building on Nobel continues.

I am sorry to report that the recently revised MTS schedule did not fulfill the request to incorporate/restore bus service to the thousands of families living east of Genesee in University City. Bottom line it's all about projected ridership.

On October 25, UCPG's special appointed committee addressed the concern related to the proposed "Pure Water" project (also referred to as "Toilet to Tap"). Councilperson Barbara Bry supported UCPG's efforts in extending the environmental response timeline to allow UCPG to convene a committee/public meeting. The main issue was the anticipated traffic congestion and noise associated with the construction of the sewer/pipeline on Genesee. The current plan indicates the underground construction (12-ft wide), would limit traffic to only one lane on the west side of Genesee during the day, and the obvious affect the associated nighttime work will have on nearby residents and businesses. The project affecting University City, (Clairemont Mesa Blvd north on Genesee to Nobel, then east on Nobel to Town Center Drive, and north on Town Center Drive to La Jolla Village Dr.), would take approximately 45 days. STAY TUNED!

San Diego City School officials will hold an important "Imagine UC 2020" meeting to update University City residents this coming November 8, 6:00pm at Spreckels Elementary. The update will include information on the planned "shared-use" agreement between the City Parks and Rec. and the San Diego City School District. New design information about the planned competitive Olympic sized pool, jogging path, and the performance pavilion will be made available. Also, included will be information on the renovations planned for both Spreckels Elementary and Standley Middle School.

Our UCCA board would like to convey its sincere wishes to you and yours for a most wonderful Thanksgiving. ## Councilmember Bry is Out and About in the UC Community

It was wonderful to celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the North University Community Library on Saturday, October 10. I was proud to present a commendation to the branch in honor of its ten years of service to the UC neighborhood. The North UC Library offers programs such as chess club, children's movement and music, and knitting circle that enrich our community and bring San Diegans together.

On October 5<sup>th</sup>, I joined UC residents at the community conversation about the process for selecting our next police chief at Standley Recreation Center. The event allowed for productive round table discussions, during which community members shared ideas and criteria for choosing San Diego's next police chief. All input received will be used throughout the recruitment and selection process, which will be managed by the City's Chief Operating Officer Scott Chadwick, on behalf of the Mayor. The City will be hiring an executive recruitment firm to assist in the process. More information is available at www.sandiego.gov/police/about/next-police-chief.

Pylons were recently installed along the median at the intersection of Edmonton Ave. and Governor Dr. The pylons were installed to improve the safety of the intersection by preventing customers leaving Chase Bank and University Square from illegally crossing the median to proceed west on Governor Dr. I would like to thank the Streets Division engineers for their attention to traffic safety in University City.

#### Additional Notice from Councilmember Bry, District 1:

The City Council meeting on proposed regulations for short-term vacation rentals scheduled for October 23, has been adjourned to allow City staff time to perform additional work on this item in response to issues raised by the City Attorney's office. Our office will share the new date via email and social media when it becomes available. My position remains the same, and I believe we have the legal backing to move forward with our proposed regulations for short-term rentals. My proposal protects the rights of those who wish to rent out their entire primary residence on a short-term basis for up to 90 days per year, and it also allows for unlimited home sharing when the host is on site to supervise. Importantly, it is the only proposal that prohibits investors from converting homes in our residential neighborhoods into permanent mini-hotels.

## Later high school start times and teen health

Early start times for high school go against the established research on teens' biological clocks. I have advocated for the school district to eventually set 8:30am as the earliest start time for our high school



students. Currently most high schools start around 7:30am.

Recently SB 328 mandating later start times for high schools was approved by the State Senate, but did not garner enough votes in the Assembly. It is now up to local districts.

Research has shown that the circadian rhythm of postpubescent teens makes it difficult for them to fall asleep before 11:00pm. Sleep deprivation causes serious problems. Two out of three U.S. high school students are sleep deprived. Later start times can result in reduced tardiness and absences, as well as students performing better, especially in first period classes. A later start can improve driving safety, emotional and physical well-being and academic achievement. Schools that end later are still able to participate in all athletic and other extracurricular activities. San Diego Unified already has a later start time at one high school, Kearny High School, which starts at 8:45am.

Research has shown that later start times do not significantly affect students' bedtimes, so there is a significant gain in sleep time. Based upon this evidence a later start time is supported by the American Medical Association, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Centers for Disease Control and the National PTA.

On October 10, the Board approved a plan to begin the conversation. There are serious financial limitations on making this change due to bus routes and schedules. Any solution must be revenue neutral. Each cluster will have the opportunity to review the research. If the parents, students and staff come to a consensus on the need for a later start time, the high school and cluster can petition a later start time from the district, which would be implemented if/when it is determined that it is financially feasible.

Check the scheduled UC Schools Cluster meetings on the Community Calendar to participate in the discussion about later start times for high school students.

Imagine UC 2020 projects are moving along in the planning stages with the cooperation of the San Diego Unified School District, the City of San Diego, Improve UC and UC Community Association members. Projects include an aquatic center, a jogging path, a stage/pavilion, an added playing field and other amenities. Standley Middle School and Spreckels Elementary will also modernize their facilities. We hope to have a joint use agreement before the school board and city council by early next year. Our goal is to have this all completed and ready for the schools and community by 2020.






## HISTORY OF VETERANS DAY

Fighting ceased in World War I when an armistice (a temporary cessation of hostilities) between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of World War I.

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day to honor the heroism of those who died in the country's service. In June 1954, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day and November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.



## MCAS Miramar Airfield Rededicated

A ceremony to rededicate the airfield at MCAS Miramar was held October 21 at the Flvina Leatherneck Aviation Museum. The airfield will be rededicated in honor of Brigadier General Joseph Jacob "Joe" Foss, who was awarded the Medal of Honor for heroism as a Marine Captain during

World War II while serving in Guadalcanal. He reached the rank of brigadier general in the South Dakota Air National Guard.

During his efforts to become a fighter pilot, Foss spent some time stationed at Naval Air Station North Island. Post service, he was later elected a South Dakota State Representative, eventually becoming the state's youngest Governor at age 39.

The ceremony will be held in conjunction with the grand opening of the Foss exhibit at the Flying Leatherneck Aviation Museum, which will display his Medal of Honor for the first time.

Brigadier General Foss served his country honorably and faithfully and was truly an exemplary Marine whose legacy should be shared by all who serve at MCAS Miramar.

## UC VETERAN: MIKE O'SULLIVAN



Mike O'Sullivan graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis with a Mechanical Engineering degree in 2002 and went on to earn his "wings of gold" as a Naval Aviator after completing Flight Training in 2004. After visiting San Diego during one of his summer training programs as a Midshipman, he fell in love with San Diego and knew this is where he wanted to spend his military career.

Mike was fortunate to be stationed at NAS North Island where he served as an SH-60B Helicopter Pilot. He conducted multiple combat deployments to both the South and West Pacific Regions. Following that tour, he was assigned to the Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command (SPAWAR) in Old Town where he held multiple Project Manager and Engineering Manager positions focused on modernizing the Navy's communications and network infrastructure across the globe.

In 2011, he volunteered to lead an Unmanned Aierial Vehicle (UAV) Detachment in Mosul, Iraq which provided intelligence for U.S. Special Forces in that area.

While Mike was fortunate to have spent the majority of his time in San Diego at that point in his career, he knew it was inevitable that the Navy would move me out of the area. For this reason, he decided to separate after nearly ten years of active duty in order to start a family and begin a new career in San Diego. After living all throughout much of the city, Mike and his wife Alicia chose UC because of its fantastic location, great schools, and small neighborhood feel.

Alicia and Mike decided to seize the opportunity and embarked upon a business venture completely unrelated to the military -Residential Real Estate. So, they are still serving others, but in an entirely different capacity as local UC Real Estate Specialists. But they haven't forgotten their military families, as they contribute back to the Home for Heroes charity.

They are the lucky parents of three-year-old boy/girl twins! They couldn't have chosen a better community to call home.

Mike is currently in the Navy Reserves and is honored to have served alongside many great men and women! Mike and his family certainly will be remembering them and those who have gone before us on this Veteran's Day.

## UC VETERAN: JAY COOK

#### Profile of a Veteran

Jay Cook and his wife Shirley are 47 year residents of UC. Jay is a retired US Navy veteran who began life in 1931, the third of five children born to a farming family in rural Southern Indiana. Orphaned at age eight, Jay began working at a dairy farm. In 1948 at age 17, Jay enlisted in the US Navy, training at Naval Training Center San Diego. With only one year of high school, Jay began as a mess cook and rose through the enlisted ranks (E-8) and later became a commissioned officer serving in various capacities such as personnel trainer, computer code and technical writer, radar officer, and aircraft maintenance officer in multiple locations throughout the US and Asia. At the start of the Korean conflict, Jay flew as a crew member on night time combat missions and served on temporary duty as a rifleman with a U.S. Marine Corps combat unit.

In 1952, Jay participated in the second hydrogen bomb test on the island of Eniwetok, as a crew member on a plane recording data from the planned drop. Selected by the Navy in 1957 for an accelerated four-year training program at the University of Washington (UW), Jay earned a BS degree in electronic engineering and an MS degree in nuclear engineering.

In 1969 while serving on the USS Kitty Hawk, Jay's plane was diverted to Da Nang AFB where an incoming mortar round demolished the plane. Jay was hospitalized and transferred eventually to US Naval Hospital San Diego where, after 7 months of recovery from internal injuries, Jay retired as a lieutenant commander.

Jay returned to San Diego and worked at Computer Sciences Corporation (CSC) until 1987. In his retirement, Jay rekindled his hobby of woodworking. filling their house with fine furniture and other projects.

Jay said the most significant event in his life was his marriage to the lovely Shirley Black whom he married in 1952. As well as being the proud parents of a daughter and son, they have two grandchildren and one great grandchild. Jay credits Shirley for making a family home and largely raising their children while he was away on military duty, underscoring the truism that military service is often a family affair.



We plan a program which will start with a Concerto for Trumpet by Tomaso Albinoni (1712) (to be played on saxophone by Steve Shields), followed by a Concerto for Bassoon by Joseph Bodin de Boismortier (1729). The program will continue with two concertos by J.S. Bach, his Concerto for two violins and orchestra and his Brandenburg Concerto number 2 (both circa 1720).

Don't feel like you need to have a powdered wig to enjoy this music; it is wonderful music to hear (and to play), full of beauty that's just as fresh today as it was when it was written almost 300 years ago. We're looking forward to presenting these pieces. I hope to see you there!






